Christopher Beale on hand to explain the breadth of the technology that is being utilised. Also, there was tea and cakes aplenty, supplied

by the local band to cater for the entire afternoon, which enabled them to raise £120 for their funds. Our new Marston ringer, Carolina (left) got the opportunity to ring rounds on the bells, her first experience of bells other than Marston, having only started in October.



Also on the same Saturday that evening, we had 14 youngsters from the local Youth Group come along to have a taster session of bellringing at St Nicholas, with everyone getting an equal share of tower and hand bell ringing during the two hours. Several of those having a go showed exceptional promise, managing to rapidly coordinate so as to manage both strokes.
