and seven helpers, tutored by Steve Vickars, practising Plain Bob Doubles at **Wigginton**, **Swalcliffe** and **Tadmarton**.

All the students got a lot out of the day and made good progress in learning and ringing the method. Two students rang their first observation and affected touches, while the others made big strides towards overcoming their fear of the method.

On Saturday 4th November, the **Red Lion pub** in **Old Marston** once again hosted a firework display to seriously rival any of the other displays in and around Oxford. Now organised by the parish council, it drew a large crowd to the centre of the village and managed to find a rare dry window for the pyrotechnics to be viewed at their optimum!

The following day on Sunday 5th November, we rang a quarter peal prior to a Choral Evensong at **St Nicholas**, which brought together the choirs from Marston and Iffley. With the use of some *'Old Singles'*, we were able to introduce several asymmetric group variations, new to us, into the quarter peal, including some strikingly named examples such as St Chrysostom, Olympic and Scorpio.
