We rang on the bells at **Hartpury** during an outing of ours back in March 2009, where the bee shelter in the churchyard takes pride of place, but the equally unique headstone went unnoticed by us at the time, so we are indebted to Andrew for being eagle-eyed and good enough to bring it to our attention:

"In Memory of John Hale of this Parish Blacksmith Who Deceased Septemb. ye 9th: 1692.



Aged 25 Yrs 4 Months.


